PARA REFLEXÃO

What is he emphasizing about worship?

As he prays and then invites everyone to sing one more song, what does he suggest happens when the church worships together?

PARA REFLEXÃO

How does he describe God's presence?

What words does he use to show that God is already present before the people arrived, and why does that matter for the prayer moment?

PARA REFLEXÃO

Who does he specifically pray for?

As he begins naming mothers, fathers, uncles, aunties, grandmothers, sons, daughters, nephews, and nieces, what does this reveal about his view of Christian community and family burden?



He will make a way where there is no way.

– God can open the way

PARA REFLEXÃO

What role does obedience play?

He says only God can stir hearts into action and obedience. How is that different from human effort alone?

PARA REFLEXÃO

What testimony stands out here?

When he thanks God for rescuing him from the ditch and says God is not done with him yet, what kind of story is he inviting others to believe about their own lives?



Stories matter. Yes. They do because it's your story in each one of our lives.

PARA REFLEXÃO

How does he connect stories and calling?

Why does he thank God for leading the conversations and for the volunteers ministering to one another, and how does that connect to his warning not to take the call lightly?

PARA REFLEXÃO

What does he ask the church to notice about God's care?

How does the prayer show that God cares about details, including the specific people being prayed for and the exact places where volunteers serve?



Holy Spirit, have your way.

— Spirit-led prayer

PARA REFLEXÃO

What does he want the church to do with these words?

As he repeatedly says the Spirit can move however He wants, what response is he modeling for the congregation to bring into suffering, grief, and waiting seasons?

PARA REFLEXÃO

How can this shape your own life?

What waiting season, grief, or unanswered prayer in your life could you bring to God with the same trust he shows here—that God is present, attentive, and still working?
