As you watch this sermon, notice how he prays at the close for people needing jobs, trusting God to open doors, give favor in interviews, and provide what is needed in a season of anxiety and uncertainty.

When he says, 'in this season,' what kind of season do you think he means for people facing joblessness and worry?

What is being trusted God to provide?

What does the preacher say God will provide for those who have decided to follow Him?

Why mention encouragement?

Why does he ask God to give encouragement to those needing employment?

— Favor in interviews

In the context of a job interview, what might 'favor in the eyes of the interviewers' mean?

PARA REFLEXÃO**How does this prayer challenge worry?**

How does praying for doors, provision, and favor challenge a heart that is anxious about the future?

PARA REFLEXÃO**Where do you need to trust God?**

What area of your life right now most needs the kind of trust this prayer models?
