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Before You Press Play

As you watch Irwin sit in the chair on stage and unpack Isaiah 55:1-3, notice how he connects being seated in worship with covenant grace, personal holiness, and surrendering your whole self to God.

What Does the Chair Mean?

As Irwin compares a classroom, courtroom, waiting room, dining room, theater, boardroom, hospital chair, electric chair, and throne, what is he trying to make you notice about a church pew?

Seated for Worship

When he asks whether the pew says watch, wait, listen, learn, belong, or worship, which meaning seems to stand out most in the sermon so far?

Why does the story of the woman who had donated for better acoustics, yet sat in the sanctuary's dead spot, matter to Irwin's point about posture and mindset?

In Isaiah 55, why does Irwin emphasize that God's invitation has no qualifiers, and what does that reveal about grace and access to God?

How does Irwin move from the image of buying bread and milk without money to the deeper truth that God wants a relationship with us so that our soul may live?

When Irwin talks about modern life, long hours of sitting, and the soul accommodating inactivity, what habits of spiritual

passivity might he be warning against?

Who Sits With You?

How does the progression in Psalm 1 help explain Irwin's warning that the people around us can normalize what we eventually accept?



It matters who you're sitting with. It matters who you're learning from because every community normalizes something.

What does the story of Herod, his banquet, and John the Baptist reveal about fearing the approval of others more than the authority of God?

What Sits on the Chair of Your Life?

When Irwin asks whether it is you, success, prestige, status, or safety sitting on the chair of your life, which rival allegiance is he pressing you to surrender?
